ABOUT THE DIVISION:

Established in 1974, the California Energy Commission is the state's primary energy policy and planning agency. Located in vibrant downtown Sacramento, within walking distance from light-rail, the state Capitol, and other amenities, the California Energy Commission is advancing many of the state's cutting edge energy and climate programs and policies. The Renewable Energy Division at the California Energy Commission is committed to expanding the use of renewable energy in California in a way that maximizes the economic, environmental, and grid-reliability benefits to all Californians.

DUTIES/RESPONSIBILITIES:

The California Energy Commission's Renewable Energy Division is looking for a dynamic, highly motivated individual who is passionate about making a difference in the lives of Californians by implementing and promoting renewable energy policies and activities.

Under the direct supervision of the Energy Resources Specialist III (Managerial), the Energy Resources Specialist III (Supervisor) will have supervisory responsibility over the Renewable Portfolio Standard (RPS) Verification unit, including implementing and administering RPS policy, RPS verification and compliance activities, and various reporting requirements. Supervisory responsibility is for technical staff that works on various aspects of RPS verification and compliance in coordination with the RPS Certification Unit. The unit may also implement activities for the Power Source Disclosure program and other renewable energy activities and programs within the Renewable Energy Division.

DESIRABLE EXPERIENCE/QUALIFICATIONS: The successful applicant should have:

- Knowledge of and ability to analyze renewable energy technologies
- Ability to coordinate the complex technical work of others
- Analyze more technical and complex situations accurately and take effective Action
- Excellent attention to detail
- Ability to communicate effectively both orally and in writing
- Ability to work independently and in a team environment

WHO MAY APPLY: Eligible candidates who are current state employees with status in the above classification, lateral transfers from an equivalent class who meet the minimum qualifications of this classification, former state employees who can reinstate into this class or persons who are reachable on a current employment list for this classification. Appointment is subject to the provisions of the SROA process: SROA/SURPLUS/ REEMPLOYMENT candidates are encouraged to apply and must attach a copy of their status letter in order to be considered. Applications will be screened and the most qualified may be contacted for an interview.

Interested applicants must submit a completed Standard State Application (Form STD. 678) with an original signature, to the contact/address listed below. Electronic applications will not be accepted. **You must clearly indicate the basis of your eligibility (i.e., list, transfer, SROA/Surplus, reinstatement, etc.), RPA #520-381 and Position #5200-4813-001 in the “Explanation Section” of the STD. 678.**
