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**NOTICE OF PROPOSED AWARD (NOPA)****Assess Vulnerability of California's Transportation Fuel Sector to Extreme Weather-Related Events and Identify Resilience Options****GFO-15-320****April 7, 2016**

On February 1, 2016, the California Energy Commission (Energy Commission) released a competitive solicitation to fund research to identify and assess vulnerabilities of California's transportation fuel sector to extreme weather-related events and identify options to promote resilience. Up to \$1,685,000 in Petroleum Violation Escrow Account (PVEA) funding is available to fund applications in the area of:

- Assessment of Vulnerability of California's Transportation Fuel Sector to Extreme Weather-Related Events and Identification of Resilience Options

The Energy Commission received three proposals by the due date of March 18, 2016. Each proposal was screened, reviewed, evaluated and scored using the criteria in the solicitation. Three proposals passed the Stage One Application Screening.

The attached "Notice of Proposed Award" identifies each applicant selected and recommended for funding by Energy Commission staff and includes the recommended funding amount and score. The total amount recommended is \$1,684,999.

Funding of the proposed project resulting from this solicitation is contingent upon the approval of this project at a publicly noticed Energy Commission Business Meeting and execution of a grant agreement. If the Energy Commission is unable to timely negotiate and execute a funding agreement with an Applicant, the Energy Commission, at its sole discretion, reserves the right to cancel or otherwise modify the pending award, and award the funds to another applicant.

In addition, the Energy Commission reserves the right to negotiate with successful applicants to modify the project scope, schedule, and/or level of funding.
